



Pediatric Outpatient Curriculum

### **Description of Rotation:**

This is a four-week block pediatric outpatient experience with direct supervision by an attending pediatrician. Supplemental longitudinal learning in the FMP supervised by Family Physician Faculty is also expected. Residents will see pediatric patients in an outpatient setting. The resident/learner will become competent and/or familiar with the appropriate evaluation and/or management of patients with pediatric syndromes/disease processes.

# **Overall Goals of Pediatric Outpatient PGY 2 Rotation:**

Residents will learn to provide evidence-based, compassionate, comprehensive pediatric outpatient care for children when they are sick and when well. When appropriate, residents will obtain information from collateral resources. Residents will be competent in synthesizing an appropriate diagnosis and treatment plan for common pediatric conditions from infancy through adolescence. Developing patient-centered treatment plans for adolescents based on comprehensive, risk-based assessments that consider the cultural, linguistic and socioeconomic background of adolescent patients will be achieved by residents. Residents will become proficient in the examination of well child care (infants to adolescents), including screening, growth and development, immunizations, anticipatory guidance, and common minor concerns, working under close supervision. They will learn how to approach common problem/sick call visits in the pediatric patient presenting in the office setting and develop a plan of action that attends to pertinent medical and psychosocial needs of the patient and family.

### Patient Care Objectives and Competencies

- PC-1: Cares for acutely ill or injured patients in urgent and emergent situations in all settings.
- PC-2: Cares for patients with chronic conditions.
- PC-3: Partners with the patient, family, and community to improve health through disease prevention and health promotion.
- PC-4: Partners with the patient to address issues of ongoing signs, symptoms, or health concerns that remain over time without clear diagnosis despite evaluation and treatment, in a patient-centered, cost-effective manner.

### **Objectives:**

- Communicate effectively and demonstrate caring and respectful behaviors when interacting with patients and their families (PC-1/1)
- Gather essential and accurate information in a concise yet comprehensive manner that includes bio-psychosocial influences (PC-3/1)
- Recognize medical emergencies in the pediatric population while in the outpatient setting (PC-1/2)
- Evaluate and become familiar with the management of common pediatric conditions to include asthma, ADHD, diabetes mellitus, acute illnesses and obesity in the outpatient clinic (PC-2/1)

## **Objectives:**

- Demonstrate medical knowledge of common routine well-child primary care conditions in the pediatric population to include, anticipatory guidance, developmental milestones, screening for developmental delays, screening for mental health concerns (MK-1/1 or 2)
- Demonstrate medical knowledge of common sick-visit primary care conditions in the pediatric population to include dehydration, pneumonia, neonatal fever/bronchiolitis, rashes/exanthems, and non-accidental trauma (MK-1/1 or 2)
